Engaging Segments of the Congregation: Families with Young Children Rev. Eric Kennaugh LCEF Vice President Ministry Solutions

Most congregations feel they are strongest in their ministry to families with young children. A strong children's ministry is used to help the whole family get engaged in the church. However, once children complete confirmation, entire families often drift away from church life.

How to engage families in ways that keep them connected long term?

1. Strategic engagement

- It's not enough to keep children and families busy in the church through their development years.
- There needs to be a plan to move the whole family forward in faith.

2. Parents as spiritual leaders

- As you develop a strategic plan for children, don't forget the parents. Many parents return to the church because they want to be spiritual leaders for their families, but they don't know how.
- Grow parents into the spiritual leaders of their homes as you grow their children's faith in Jesus.

3. Milestones of faith

- Develop milestones of faith that move children along in developmentally appropriate spiritual growth plans.
- Baptism, first children's Bible for parents to read to little ones, child's own first Bible, taking on a role as spiritual leader with younger children, Confirmation, etc.
- Think of the outcomes you look for in a fully matured disciple of Jesus, then look at how you are intentionally developing these characteristics in your children's program.

4. Parents connected to the community

- Be intentional about connecting parents to the community of the church.
- Teach biblical parenting and make space for parents to build friendships and support systems.
- Keep growing the parents in ways that match what you're teaching the children.

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
